Charlotte is the largest city in North Carolina, regarded by its residents as the Gateway to the South. There are a large number of corporations and financial institutions in the city. The employment base is predominantly white collar. During the 1970s, when many companies relocated their central offices in Charlotte, the resulting growth and diversity gave it the reputation of being a dynamic city with a bright future. The economic upturn and resulting low unemployment rate, however, had not reached all of Charlottes communities. Fairview Homes, the UIACP demonstration site, was located in one such economically depressed community. The 1979 medium family income in the community was 4, 374 per year, which was among the lowest in the city. Approximately 40 percent of the families had incomes below the poverty level, and less than 30 percent of the adults had graduated from high school. Unemployment was high--six times the city-wide average--and 35 percent of those who were employed worked in low-paying service industry jobs. Family stability suffered as a consequence; only about 35 percent of the households were intact nuclear families...
