At only 12 percent of the prewar level, it is not quite able to maintain the per capita consumption of prewar days. According to the summary, nearly all parts of the world have contributed toward the upward trend in agricultural production; but the greatest advance of all has been made in North America, which now produces 50 percent more than in the prewar years. Latin America is producing 30 percent more. The least progress has probably been made in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe; in the latter, production is still below the prewar level. Western Europe has made substantial increases and is now well above its prewar production. The Middle East is producing substantially more than it did before the war and has a good supply of grain for feed, food, and forage.
